We do not reserve any pavilions. Pavilions at the Dauberton and Saginaw Parks are a "First Come First Served".



DAUBERTON PARK

It has a pavilion, walking path, play area and equipment for ages 12 and under. This Park is located at 300 S. Poplar Court, in Manchester on the west side of the Township off N. George Street. Take Forge Hill Road to Boxwood Road and go one block on Boxwood Road to Poplar Court and turn right.



SAGINAW PARK

It has a small pavilion, swings, picnic tables, ball field, and a play area for ages 12 and under. This Park is located at the intersection of York Street and Market Street in Saginaw.

CONEWAGO CREEK RECREATION AREA

This area contains six soccer fields which are located at 1500 Wago Road. This area is only open to the public when the soccer fields are being used for NEYSA activities.



JOHN RUDY COUNTY PARK

John Rudy County Park is located in East Manchester Township at 400 Mundis Race Road, totaling 150 acres. It offers sports fields, sand volleyball courts, horseshoe pits, a 3.1-mile cross-country running trail, dog park, BMX track and large open spaces. Pavilions with picnic tables can be rented for a nominal fee by contacting York County Parks at 717-840-7440. The Park also connects to the northern extension of the Heritage Rail Trail.

The Public Works Department offers many services:

LEAF COLLECTION - BURNING LEAVES IS PROHIBITED

For several weeks in the fall, the Public Works Department collects leaves throughout the Township. Leaves are to be placed in long narrow piles next to the curb or edge of your property. Do not rake sticks, brush, trash or animal waste into the leaves. Due to unknown weather conditions, it is impossible to schedule specific days. Our crew will continue moving throughout the Township until the last day of pickup.

SNOW REMOVAL

To assist the Public Works Department in effectively removing snow and ice from the streets, please keep in mind the following:

- It is the responsibility of property owners to clean their sidewalks.
- For your safety, please clear away the snow from fire hydrants near your property.
- Do not shovel, blow or plow the snow from your driveway and/or sidewalk into the street.
- Keep the storm water inlets open near your property.

When snow is on the roads, please:

- Do not park on the roads or in cul-de-sacs.
- Ensure your mailbox does not extend over the edge of the road.
- Shovel your driveway AFTER the snowplow clears your road.
- Do not shovel your snow onto the road.
- And lastly, be patient!

STREET SWEEPING

Depending on weather conditions, the Public Works Department begins sweeping streets in March/April and will continue until completion.

SIDEWALK & DRIVEWAY CLEARING



 Plowing, blowing or shoveling ice or snow onto Township streets is strictly prohibited. If you pile snow on the street beside your driveway entrance, the passing plow will simply deposit the snow back into your entrance. Shovel or blow the snow into/onto your property, this will reduce the amount the plow pushes into your entrance.

Sidewalks must be cleared with 24 hours after snow stops falling.
 Do not pile snow between the street and sidewalk, it could be pushed back on the walk by the passing plow.

ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER

The Animal Control Officer is responsible for animal control in the Township. The duties include, but are not limited to enforcement of the State Dog Law, responding to calls and retrieving strays. Stray dogs will be picked up at no expense to Township residents but a "return to owner" fee will be accessed.

For information about free-roaming cats, contact the SPCA at 717-764-6109.

Residents are to call 911 for animal control and they will dispatch the Animal Control Officer. All wildlife and dead animals fall under this program.

RURAL LIVING AGRICULTURAL

East Manchester Township has always been a rural-agricultural community and continues to protect our farmlands. Tractors and farming equipment are often on rural roadways. The drivers of the farm equipment have limited visibility. Use caution when passing these vehicles, make sure you have plenty of time to pass safely.

Some agricultural practices such as late hours, fertilizer applications and crop management, may conflict with the perception of "living in the country". These practices are protected by State Laws from nuisance complaints.

East Manchester Township's Ordinance 2003-1 states all residential, commercial and industrial establishments are required to participate in the Township's recycling program - **RECYCLING IS MANDATORY**.

BURNING OF RECYCLABLES IS PROHIBITED PER TOWNSHIP "NO BURN" ORDINANCE 2007-1.

- The Township has two "yard waste" collection days, one in May and one in October. Penn Waste will collect an unlimited number of bags or bundles placed at the curb on these days. Check the Penn Waste website or the Township website for specific dates.
- There is one "large item" pick-up available each week.

If regular trash service is not used, you can obtain orange trash bags from the Township for a fee.

WHAT TYPE OF BUILDING PERMIT DO YOU NEED?

East Manchester Township requires residential permits for many types of construction and building work. Building permits are for projects falling under the State Building Code and require inspections. Please allow up to (15) fifteen business days for Zoning and Residential building permits and (30) thirty days for Commercial/Industrial building permits.

Examples of work requiring a Zoning Permit:

- Construction and/or installation of a fence, shed, unattached carport or unattached garage, under 1,000 square feet.
- Construction and/or installation of a patio, including paver patio or porch with no roof or walls.
- Construction and/or installation of a walkway on the property other than the sidewalk along the street (this requires a different permit).
- Construction and/or installation of a deck where the deck is less than (30) thirty inches from the ground.
- · Widening or new paving on an existing driveway and includes stoned areas.

Examples of work requiring a Building Permit:

- Building an addition onto your house, including attached garages and carports.
- Construction and/or installation of an unattached garage is 1,000 square feet or bigger.
- Above ground or in ground pools, even wall-less, portable pools and hot tubs. Any pool (24) twenty-four inches or deeper needs a permit.
- Adding a roof to a patio, porch or deck where the roof is attached to the house.
- Construction and/or installation of a deck where the deck is (30) thirty inches or more from the ground.
- Installation of doors and windows if new doors and windows are of a different size.
- Upgrading an electrical service.
- The addition or relocation of electrical wiring or plumbing.
- Finishing a basement.

Examples of work NOT requiring any permit:

- Repair to existing structures such as floorboards on a deck.
- Sealcoating a driveway.
- Putting new shingles on roof.
- Replacing or installing siding on a house.
- Replacing windows and door with new ones of the same size.
- Replacing a garage door (replacing a manual door with an electric door will require an electrical permit).
- Wallpaper, carpet, tile, paint and interior cabinetry such as kitchen cabinets.

Please contact the Zoning Officer if you are unsure what type of permit you need. Commercial/Industrial businesses should call the Township for permitting questions.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE TIPS FOR HOMEOWNERS!!

Here are some of the most common "problems" homeowners can encounter. By staying on top of these issues you can avoid letters from the Township (which could result in fines).

- Mow the grass. Once grass or weeds get higher than (12) twelve inches, it is a violation.
- Blowing grass into the road is not allowed as it creates issues in the storm water drains. This is considered an illicit discharge.
- Old cars or project cars need to be stored indoors. A vehicle that is not up to date on state inspection or inoperable may not be stored outside.
- Keep trash, junk and yard debris cleaned up on your property.
- Additional off-street parking must be provided for campers, RV's, boats and trailers. All vehicles/trailers must be up-to-date with registrations, license plates and inspections.
